Board News

Note: all Board meetings are open to Members. They are held the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Clubhouse. *Next meeting is on April 10th.* You can address the Board at the beginning of the meeting, or ask Jack Caldwell, our President, to include items of concern on the agenda.

Minutes of March 13 meeting. Submitted by Francis Bravo.

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM. Board Members present – Jack Caldwell, Wade Brown, Bill Disney, Rich Detering, Harry Cummings, Francis Bravo. Absent: Joanne Jeppesen; Walt Wollny.

Maintenance Report (Bill Disney)

Confirmed the paperwork for the fence project would be submitted to City of Redmond prior to next board meeting. Requested that May 20th be reserved for the 2006 Spring Cleaning Day. Suggested that end of May, early June would be the best time of the year to proceed with building the new fence.

Tam O' Shanter is unable to assist Brae Burn with harvesting clay cores from soil and therefore we will need to plan and budget this activity. This is typically done at least twice a year. The cost to pay for this service / equipment rental is approximately \$500 per session. Maintenance pointed out that this course repair work is distinct from deep drilling which is completed once a year and costs approximately \$1700 for service / equipment rental.

A permit to cut and remove trees from the property is being prepared for submission to City of Redmond; the cost is \$75 application fee.

Vice President's Report (Wade Brown)

Announced that one new associate family had joined the waiting list and paid their \$500 deposit. In addition, an associate family that had previously announced they would be leaving Brae Burn has changed their plans. They have already submitted their monthly dues.

The board acknowledged that **Kyle and Amy Rudkin** are new Brae Burn members after moving into the Evans' former house (Lot 21). Their phone number will be in the new Roster.

Treasurer's Report (Rich Detering)

Presented the monthly spreadsheet and reviewed delinquent payments including several Brae Burn members and one associate. Treasure consulted with archiving experts and was advised that Brae Burn should discard any bills over three years old but retain any and all letters, purchase slips, and tax related documents.

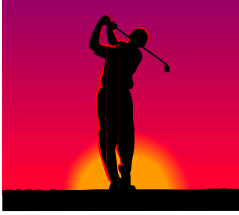
Submitted invoices from R&R, Wilbur Ellis, and reviewed the credit card statement with Maintenance. In addition, a notice from Sand & Gravel highlighted their need to raise product prices in 2006.

Golf Report (Francis Bravo)

Acknowledged the ongoing efforts by the Golf Committee to survey the neighborhood and Associates regarding Brae Burn golf activities and pointed out the next committee meeting would be held on Wednesday March 15. Francis was asked to confirm and verify tentative event dates and submit final draft to Debra Holman for use in the new roster.

Harry Cummings volunteered to host the dinner welcoming new members and all associates in preparation for the upcoming golf and social season. The **evening of April 15th** has been proposed for this event.

Golf News

Clean up your clubs and shine your shoes (or get out the boots), mark your calendars, and get ready for our 2006 season.

Golf Committee Survey. The survey was designed to gather ideas on what steps could be taken to increase Member and Associate participation in golf events. We had an excellent 36% overall response rate (31% of Member households and 42% of Associate households). The following general conclusions can be drawn from the survey.

Brae Burn golfers would participate more if:

- more events were during non-working hours,
- more events had “team” or “non-standard” formats,
- more events allowed guests or kids to play,
- more events had a nine-hole option, and
- they were “better” golfers.

Members and associates are very interested in a Hole-in-One Fundraiser and have mixed reactions to a regular family golf event and to a regular weekend “away” tournament. Non-golfers and beginners would like to take lessons, especially cheap, group lessons at Brae Burn.

Most other suggestions focused on active recruitment of newer or younger Members and Associates to encourage their participation.

The Golf Committee will be making recommendations based on the survey results. Call or email Doug Duncan if you want to see complete survey results.

Ladies Golf Announcement. We would like to invite all the women members, associates, and emeritus members of Brae Burn to join us in playing Ladies Golf. There are many of you who have never joined us in the past for one reason or another. We want to assure you that we have all levels of players, from 1st timers to our Club Champions. We all come out to enjoy the game of golf and have fun while getting to better know our neighbors. We would like to welcome you and to have you join us for the up coming Spring Season. Guests are welcome at a fee of \$3 per week.

We will start our Spring Golf season on Wednesday March 29th 12:00 noon. We will start with a brief meeting and introductions, while enjoying coffee and dessert, followed by 9 holes of golf at approximately 12:30 PM. A schedule and copy of our rules will be available at the meeting. We will try to answer any questions that you might have. We would like you to join us for our 1st meeting, even if you are unable to play golf that day. If weather is a problem, we will decide at that time whether or not to play. Dues are \$5.00 for Spring Golf and will be collected at our 1st meeting.

Following the Spring Golf season we will have a Ladies Spring Luncheon at a local restaurant on May 24th. If you choose not to join us for golf we would still like to extend an invitation to you to join us for our luncheon. Just let us know if you are interested in attending the luncheon and we will call prior to the date to let you know the location, time and confirm your attendance.

We use the Brae Burn handicaps in our league. If you have not yet established a handicap at Brae Burn, all you need to have is 5 score cards turned into the Handicap Chairman, Tim Horst. These only need to be for 9 holes. These cards should be attested and put in the box on the West side of the clubhouse (across from the bulletin board). However, if you have not yet established a handicap, you are still welcome to play and begin to establish your handicap.

In the spring and fall we only play 9 holes each Wednesday. We have 9 hole and 18 hole divisions during the summer. We also have two Flights (levels of play) and these are divided according to individual handicaps. *Ladies Golf "Regulations" in flyer in this Birdie.*

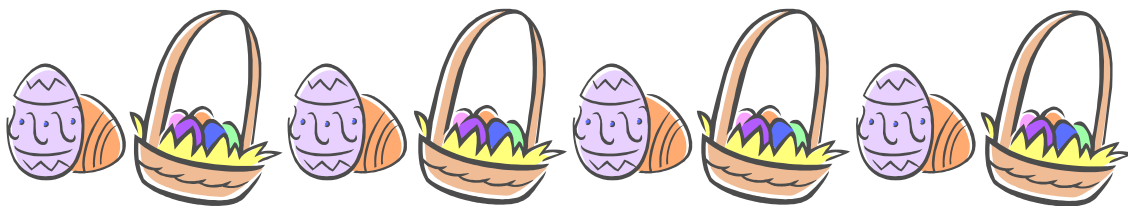

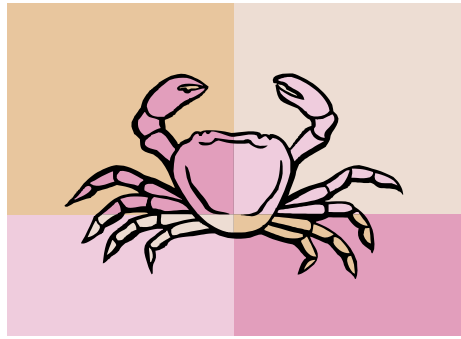

Brae Burn Ladies Golf Group "Regulations"

March, 2006

- A. Brae Burn Ladies play golf each Wednesday, beginning March 29th and ending in October.
- B. Nine (9) holes are played in the Spring (at 12:30 pm) and the Fall (at 9:00 am depending on the weather) with coffee and dessert following. Eighteen (18) holes are played in the Summer at 9:00 am, with lunch following. The kick-off meeting of the Brae Burn Ladies Golf season will begin on March 30th at NOON on the first day of Spring Golf. Weather permitting, 9 holes of golf will be played after the business meeting.
- C. During the Spring and Fall golf season, we will meet at the clubhouse fifteen (15) minutes before play is to start and teams will be formed. A weekly sign-up sheet for Summer golf is posted on the bulletin board. When possible, sign-up in ***twosomes or threesomes***. Sign-up to make up a foursome only when necessary. If it becomes apparent you will not be able to play after you have signed up, cross off your name on the sign-up sheet, and **then notify your playing partners and the hostesses. Players will be called by the Tournament Chairs if golf play is canceled due to weather.**
- D. A sign up sheet will be circulated weekly for volunteers to sign up to host and to provide food each week.
- E. Dues: Spring Session: \$ 5.00
Summer Session: \$15.00
Fall Session: To Be Decided
- F. Officers for Brae Burn Ladies Golf are Captain, Co-Captain, Tournament Chairman, Assistant Tournament Chairman, and the Secretary/Treasurer. New Officers are selected at the end of the calendar year, to take over at the beginning of the next calendar year.
- G. Brae Burn Ladies Golf flyers and announcements will be posted on the outdoor bulletin board near the handicap sheets.
- H. **Summer Session Tournament:**
1. If you wish to play and be eligible for prizes at the end of the Summer Session Tournament, you must have an established handicap prior to the start of the Summer Session. In order to establish a handicap, you must turn in five (5) 9-hole scorecards that have been attested. Place in the handicaps box near the bulletin board. That will establish your handicap, which will be posted on the Handicap Listing on the bulletin board.
 2. If you wish to be eligible for prizes at the end of the Summer Session Tournament, you must play the required number of games during the tournament schedule. Each year the Tournament Chairman will determine the number of games and announce it in the yearly schedule. The required number of games for the 2006 Summer Session is seven (7). The prizes for Summer Session play will be awarded at the Ladies Invitational Tournament Dinner. The Ladies Invitational Tournament is a one-day event in which all Brae Burn ladies and their guest are welcome to participate and they will be eligible for that day's prizes.

Specific Brae Burn Ladies Golf Rules

Those not hitting on hole #5 from the tee, or unable to hit the ball over, will place the ball between markers on the West side of the green, and will be hitting five (5).

Those not able to hit over #6 from the tee, may go to the area between the path and the bottom steps of the alternate tee. You will be hitting five (5), and may not tee up the ball.

If you decide you have an unplayable lie while in a sand trap, you may move your ball to another location in the sand trap, no closer to the hole, taking a 1-stroke penalty.
